The new schools Operating Model

ERO maintains a regular review programme to evaluate and report on the education and care of young people in schools.

Under our new Operating Model, ERO will shift from event-based external reviews to supporting each school in a process of continuous improvement.

This more differentiated approach will use a developmental evaluation that reflects an individual school's context, culture and needs. It aims to strengthen the capability of all schools through embedding a continuous improvement approach, strengthening schools' own engagement with and accountability to whānou.

ERO will become an evaluation partner alongside each school, to support every school to be a great school and every child a success.

What doesn't change is our commitment to putting the child at the heart of everything we do.

At ERO, we have a relentless focus on supporting Pacific learners. We are proud and humbled to have the privilege of Taule'ale'ausumai Violet Tu'uga Stevenson, Pule Pasifika Director Evaluation and Review Pacific based in Auckland, leading our <u>Pacific Strategy</u>, which is ERO's commitment in ensuring that Pacific learners reach their potential.

The Strategy was informed by ERO's previous Pacific strategies and evidence gathered about Pacific learners through our evaluations. It was further refined by ERO's Pasifika Fono through talanoa with ERO staff, parents and families of Pacific learners, Pacific communities and with the education sector.

ERO's new evaluation approach offers the opportunity for a deeper insight and meaningful talanoa about and with our Pacific learners, their parents, families and communities. Its tailored approach will understand each school's individual context, culture, strengths and priorities; its targeted approach will allow ERO to direct more resource into working with the schools that will benefit most.

Over time, we hope to develop a large pool of Leadership Partners who will contribute to effective school evaluation within our new evaluation approach, and who will be able to share their increased knowledge and understanding about evaluation across their school networks and communities.
