Evaluation for Improvement in Schools and Early Childhood Services

Purpose

1. This briefing accompanies two new resources to support evaluation for improvement in schools and early childhood services.

The resources

Principles of Practice: Education Evaluation for Improvement in Schools and Early Childhood Services

- 2. Principles of Practice: Education Evaluation for Improvement in Schools and Early Childhood Services is one of the suite of resources developed by the Education Review Office (ERO) to support education evaluation practice. These Principles of Practice were Initially published in 2018 as an internal document to guide ERO's evaluation work. In building and supporting evaluation capability and capacity in early childhood services and schools, the Principles of Practice can usefully guide the evaluation work we do together.
- 3. The eight *Principles of Practice* are drawn from evaluation theory and research that show how evaluation supports and promotes improvement. In developing and enacting context specific approaches to evaluation ERO has drawn on Kaupapa Māori and Western knowledges and perspectives.
- 4. We will publish this resource on ERO's website and use it with early childhood services and schools as part of our approaches to external evaluation.

Internal evaluation as a catalyst for change

- 5. This resource draws on recent Education Review Office (ERO) national evaluation reports to highlight how schools, both primary and secondary, have been evaluating teaching and learning and then using the findings to improve outcomes for students. In pursuing equity and excellence, some have made significant shifts in pedagogical, assessment and curriculum practice. ERO found that schools that significantly improved outcomes for students based their priorities for action on the findings from high quality internal evaluation.
- 6. The examples of internal evaluation included in this resource span a range of different school contexts and aspects of curriculum, teaching and assessment for learning.

7. We will publish this resource on ERO's website and use it with schools as part of our Schools: Evaluation for improvement approach.
